Author A.C. Frieden Heads to a Writing Retreat in Cabo Polonio

CABO POLONIO, Uruguay (Jan. 5, 2012) – International thriller author A.C. Frieden went on a writing retreat to Cabo Polonio, a secluded hamlet located in the eastern coast of Uruguay. The village is several miles from the nearest highway and is reachable only by 4x4 vehicles capable of crossing sand dunes. Its geographic isolation, coupled with the lack of electricity, running water and other amenities of contemporary life, has for decades attracted thousands of visitors every year, including many writers, painters, musicians and other artists and tourists who enjoy a bohemian setting. The village's most notable landmark is the lighthouse, which unlike the rest of the village, does have an electrical connection. Many villagers operate generators, which are a necessity for the few small *posadas*, the village clinic and the handful of restaurants, most of which operate primarily in summer.

This was Frieden's second time in the village but his first staying several nights. "The sense of isolation only really sets in when you stay overnight," said Frieden, "and especially when the generator power at the Hostería La Perla—the only hotel there—cuts out after dinner and the rest of town falls into darkness, with only the moonlight and a few campfires offering any signs of life."

In the summer, the village offers a warm, tranquil and serene setting for authors to concentrate on their trade. The village itself has two beaches and another coastal area home to hundreds of sea lions. Stretching both north and south of the village are miles of undeveloped beaches and sand dunes, making the area one of the most picturesque places in Uruguay.

"In addition to a writing retreat," Frieden stated, "I also used the time to research the village, as it will be featured in one of my upcoming thrillers. I'm not sure quite what the scene will be, but I explored several options as I walked around the village by day and at night."
