It was an instant hit, and after the New York Times got wind of it, the press began to recognize this venue as a serious player in city's literary scene. It has since become a celebrated literary venue, attracting writers from across America to come to this bar and read from their latest books, while mingling with readers over drinks. Fitting the name "KGB", the bar's walls are filled with authentic propaganda posters, photos, paintings and other artifacts from the former Soviet Union. Long before authors began reading at the KGB Bar, the building where it is located was a brothel, speakeasy and casino run by mobster Lucky Luciano.
